

• Dress Code

Your school uniform confirms your attendance at St. Paul the Apostle School and is a symbol of unity within the school community. It minimizes distractions in the learning process. It is important that you take pride in your appearance by wearing your complete uniform **always remembering that by wearing it inside and outside the classroom and the school you are representing the school and your behavior should be a credit to both yourself and school community.**

BOYS

- **Greene Uniform** grey pants, yellow shirt with buttons buttoned and plaid tie
- Grey Sweater Vest or Grey Sweater with School emblem
- Black Tie Oxford – No Sneakers or Boots
- Grey belt with pants or shorts
- No colored T-shirts under uniform short
- No earrings, no tattoos, no body piercing
- No fade haircuts
- Hair neat and well groomed and not below shirt collar
- Summer uniform is yellow knit shirt with grey pants or grey shorts

GIRLS

- **Greene Uniform** plaid jumper in grades Pre-K to 5
- **Greene Uniform** maize rounded collared blouse in Grades Pre-K to 5
- Green plaid formal tie and grey knee high socks in Grades Pre-K to 5
- **Greene Uniform** plaid skirt, grey sweater vest, pale maize pointed collared blouse, grey knee-high socks (worn to the knee) in Grades 6 to 8
- Summer uniform is a pale maize dress with white socks OR yellow knit shirt with grey walking shorts with white socks OR yellow knit shirt with plaid skirt
- Girls may wear earrings but loops bigger than a quarter and dangling earrings are not permitted
- Blue leather shoes – no slip-ons

Personal Appearance

A good personal hygiene routine should be followed daily: ears, neck and fingernails should be given special attention. When appropriate, children should be instructed in the use of deodorant.

Uniforms should be neat and clean.

Hair should be clean and well groomed. The boys' hair should not be below the shirt collar. Bangs should not be so long that they impede vision.

Parents will be notified if a child comes to school consistently in an unkempt manner. If no improvement is noticed within a reasonable amount of time, an appointment with the parents and principal will be made.
